- How will we know when we've stepped off the narrow path?² God's way reflects God's character; do the things you've listed match his character?

3. God's Resources – The Right Tools



- What equipment, training, people, or finances are required? What do we have on hand? What do we need to obtain?³
- What outside help do we need to engage?
- What research do we need to do?

4. God's Timing – The Right Timing



- Who will do what by when?
- How will we measure progress? When will we check progress?
- What timing do we need to leave up to God alone?⁴

5. God's Blessings – The Right Motives and Rewards



- What will be the rewards of doing God's will?
- What are the natural consequences of neglecting God's Will?
- What happens if we fail?
- How will we handle failure?⁵
